- 1. It is strongly recommended to transfer single measurement data and aggregated data in **HBM4EU** format using the HBM4EU data template and HBM4EU analysis script (R) respectively. This will enable comparison between data collections and analyses.

The data will become accessible via the HBM4EU repository to nominated users⁵. The data contact point is responsible for granting and revoking access to files in the HBM4EU repository.

The access conditions:

1. For aggregated data and anonymised single measurement data:

This data should be shared via the IPCHEM portal website. Optionally and under responsibility of the data contact point the HBM4EU repository can be chosen as mean to share data to nominated user. Optionally, an agreement on use of the data can be made between the data contact point and the data user under responsibility of the data contact point.

2. For pseudonymised single measurement data:

This data is shared via the HBM4EU repository. Before the data can be uploaded to the HBM4EU repository a **Data controller – data processor agreement needs to be established between the data controller and JRC**: It is emphasised that JRC is only responsible to ensure secure storage, upload and

Before granting access to third parties, i.e. nominated users⁶ (EU id) a **Data controller – data** processor agreement on the processing of the data by nominated people must be established.

2. Data User:

Next, the Data Contact Point shall send a request to obtain authorization for the Data User to be able to login to the HBM4EU repository (with the e-mail address coupled to the EU ID of the Data User in CC) to IPCHEM support team (jrc-ipchem-support@ec.europa.eu).
